### WHAT IS THE OPERATIONS COUNCIL?

The Operations Council (Ops Council) is responsible for daily operations of the society. Six members oversee six general program areas and committees: Worship, Education, Fellowship, Stewardship, Outreach, Fundamentals/Administration. The FUSN Treasurer is also a member of the Council.

While the Board of Trustees (BOT) addresses the policy, strategic and fiduciary aspects of FUSN, the Operations Council deals with issues like room rental

rates, approving use of rooms, fire drill plans, table space at coffee hour, insurance, buildings and grounds. The spectrum of topics is very concrete! We develop, review and propose the annual budget that the BOT votes on.

Operations Council members are elected by the congregation and serve three-year terms. This year, the members and their liaison areas are:

The Minister and DLRE also attend each meeting. Operations Council meets monthly. Twice a year Operations Council hosts all Committee Chairs to update and share the issues, challenges and priorities each committee is addressing. Saturday, **November 19**, 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m., in the Chapel this year, and then again on **March 18**.

Annually, the Operations Council has a retreat to clarify its own priorities for the year, and specific program roles of each member. This was held on **October 2**.

# GREEN SANCTUARY COMMITTEE OUTING, SUNDAY OCT. 23

After coffee hour on Sunday, October 23, you are invited to walk through Newton's Flowed Meadow Conservation Area, which offers a surprising diversity of habitats for an area just 20 or acres in size. It's located in Auburndale off of West Pine St. We will see Charles River bird life from a shoreline rich with sweet pepper bush, an upland oak forest that hosts a shallow kettle hole, and marshy areas with cattail and winterberry. A local fern expert has found over 10 species of fern and club moss in this mix of wetland and forest, and we can teach you most of them.

you have them, and stroll the trails with Green Sanctuary naturalists Eric Olson and George Martins. This event is coordinated with the sale of sandwiches by the FUSN choir. Support the choir, and enjoy the intricate web of all existence at Flowed Meadow.
